<p style="font-size: x-small; margin: 0;">Always yield to the vehicle on your right Do Not Use Outer Lane for No More than Two Exits!</p> <div style="display: flex; justify-content: space-around;"> <div style="width: 48%;"> <p style="font-size: x-small; margin: 0;">DRIVING LEFT</p> <p style="font-size: x-small; margin: 0;">When turning left:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Approach from the outer lane • Move to the inner lane • Give way and enter when there is a safe gap • Release left hand • Stay in the Outer Lane </div> <div style="width: 48%;"> <p style="font-size: x-small; margin: 0;">DRIVING RIGHT ON MAINWAY & 2nd Exit</p> <p style="font-size: x-small; margin: 0;">When turning right or making a U-turn:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Approach from the inner lane • Release left hand • Give way and enter when there is a safe gap • Stay in the inner lane • Release left hand </div> </div>	<p style="font-size: x-small; margin: 0;">Large Vehicles</p> <p style="font-size: x-small; margin: 0;">Drivers should be aware that large trucks may not be able to pass through roundabouts. Therefore, when you observe an exit sign, you should take the roundabout through a safe gap. If you have a truck that is too large to pass through a roundabout, do not attempt to pass.</p>	<p style="font-size: x-small; margin: 0;">Pedestrian Signs</p> <p style="font-size: x-small; margin: 0;">Before crossing the roundabout, pedestrians should check for the direction of approach traffic. That is, if you are walking on the main road, roundabouts have a stop sign showing a safe area before entering roundabouts. Be aware of vehicle crossing and waiting at the roundabout.</p>	<p style="font-size: x-small; margin: 0;">Cyclist</p> <p style="font-size: x-small; margin: 0;">Always keep an eye on the traffic and consider that you need to roundabout. That may not be a road with a roundabout. The rules relating to pedestrians apply to cyclists too. Always wear your seat belt when approaching a roundabout.</p>
<p style="font-size: x-small; margin: 0;">DRIVING STRAIGHT AHEAD</p> <p style="font-size: x-small; margin: 0;">When going straight ahead:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Give way and enter when there is a safe gap • Release left hand • Release both hands and stay in that lane 	<p style="font-size: x-small; margin: 0;">DRIVING STRAIGHT AHEAD</p> <p style="font-size: x-small; margin: 0;">When entering a Single / Paired Lane:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Release left hand • Give way and enter when there is a safe gap for the inner lane • Single Lane / Paired Lane into a Single Lane • Give way and enter when there is a safe gap • Release left hand, Double Release Drive Wheel • Release left hand 	<div style="border: 2px solid red; padding: 5px; background-color: #f9e79f;"> <p style="font-weight: bold; font-size: small; margin: 0;">Choose Your Lane:</p> <p style="font-size: x-small; margin: 0;">Lane choice at a roundabout is similar to a standard intersection. When approaching, choose either the outer or inner lane that corresponds to your desired destination. Lane choice is based on the driver's destination. The outer lane allows right, straight ahead, left-turn and U-turns only. The inner lane movement includes straight ahead or straight ahead movements.</p> <p style="font-weight: bold; font-size: small; margin: 0;">Emergency Vehicles:</p> <p style="font-size: x-small; margin: 0;">Always give emergency vehicles the right of way when they approach. If you have any vehicles at the roundabout, pull over to the right allowing emergency vehicles to pass. Never enter the roundabout.
