<p>Always yield to the vehicle on your right Do Not Use Outer Lane for No More than Two Exits!</p> <div style="display: flex; justify-content: space-between;"> <div style="width: 48%;"> <p>DRIVING LEFT</p> <p>When turning left:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Approach from the outer lane • Move to the inner lane • Give way and enter when there is a safe gap • Release left hand • Stay in the Outer Lane </div> <div style="width: 48%;"> <p>DRIVING RIGHT ON MAINWAY & 2nd Exit</p> <p>When turning right or making 2 Exits:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Approach from the inner lane • Release left hand • Give way and enter when there is a safe gap • Stay in the inner lane • Release left hand </div> </div>	<p>Large Vehicles</p> <p>Drivers should be aware that large trucks may actually have a smaller footprint. Therefore, when you observe an all size large vehicle with roundabouts through a roundabout you should:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Give way to a vehicle already in the roundabout • Give way to a vehicle already in the roundabout • Give way to a vehicle already in the roundabout • Give way to a vehicle already in the roundabout 	<p>Pedestrian Rights</p> <p>Before crossing the roundabout, pedestrians should check for the direction of approach traffic. That is, if you are walking on the roundabout, you should give way to a vehicle already in the roundabout. Be aware of vehicle entering and exiting the roundabout.</p>	<p>Cyclist</p> <p>Always keep an eye on for vehicles and consider their needs in roundabouts. That may not be a vehicle, but a pedestrian. The cyclist's right of way is protected as long as they are in the roundabout. Cyclists should not be riding their bikes when approaching, entering or leaving roundabouts.</p>
<p>DRIVING STRAIGHT AHEAD</p> <p>When going straight ahead:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Give way to a vehicle already in the roundabout • Release left hand 	<p>DRIVING STRAIGHT AHEAD</p> <p>When driving in a straight roundabout:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Release left hand • Give way to a vehicle already in the roundabout • Release left hand • Give way to a vehicle already in the roundabout • Release left hand 	<p>Choose Your Lane:</p> <p>Lane choice at a roundabout is similar to a standard intersection. When approaching, choose either the outer or inner lane that corresponds to your desired destination. Lane choice is based on the driver's destination. The outer lane allows right, straight ahead, and left movements. The inner lane movement includes straight ahead or straight ahead movements.</p> <p>Emergency Vehicles:</p> <p>Always give emergency vehicles the right of way when they approach. If you have not yet entered the roundabout, pull over to the right allowing emergency vehicles to pass. Never enter the roundabout. Continue to your exit and then pull over to the right, allowing the emergency vehicles to maneuver around you.</p>
